Why do professionals need support? PREVIOUS REACTION FROM FIRE & EMS CHIEFS

- "Aren't they all sort of 'trauma-junkies'?"
- "Didn't they learn to cut off their feelings?"
- "Aren't they simply used to it?"
- "Don't you make these fire-fighters/paramedics weaker by talking about their traumatic stress?"
- "Don't you create stress, by talking about it?"
- "The not-invented-by-engineers-syndrom"

How did it all start within Fire Brigades & Ambulance Services?

- **◆** Psycho-Social Support for Peacekeepers
 - Pre-, Peri- & Post-Deployment Support Activities
 - First spontaneous initiatives among colleagues
 - Contact with the CISM (Mitchell, 1983) network
- **◆** Spontaneous 'Demobilisation' & 'Defusing'
- Structured Help through 'Debriefing'
- Multidisciplinary 'Peer Debriefing'
- **♦** Prevention, Care & After-Care

FiST: Working Principles & Rationale

- **♦** Early Detection of Critical and/or Exceptional Interventions
 - Proactive Outreaching : Primary & Secondary Prevention of PTSR/PTSD
 - Selection & Training of Peer Support Officers: 1st Line -> FiST Antennas
 - Development of Crisis Scenarios : Pre-Incident Networking across "Disaster Disciplines" & Collective Field Training
 - Action Charts & SOP's : Multidisciplinary Focus (Fire, EMS, Police)
- ♦ Systematic Analysis of Emotionally Disturbing & Potentially Traumatising Interventions (Keeping the Score...)
- **◆** Time Axis of Trauma-Working Through: Long Term Support
- **◆** Supervised <u>Peer Debriefing</u>: On-Scene, Immediate & Post-Immediate Support Activities to Prevent Emotional Losses

 Stress Evaluations or Debriefings

♦ FiST Coordination Team

- Coordinate & plan debriefing/support activities
- Planning debriefing/support activities
- Putting together 'outreach teams' (on-scene)
- Putting together 'debriefing teams'
- Keeping Intervention Files Up-to-Date
- Coaching of less experienced debriefers

The Management of Emotionally Disturbing Interventions

Pre-Deployment Support Activities

- ◆ (S)elect Potential FiST-Members among Firefighters and/or Paramedics during initial 3 Hr trauma workshop
 - 360° selection procedure (Volunteer, Approoved Confidantes)
 - Selection Interview with FiST Trainers (Previous Trauma)
- **♦** Initial Training Course for FiST-Members
 - 5 Day Residential Training Week, 4 Follow-Up Seminars, Permanent Supervision & Intervision, Regular Vent Sessions
- **♦** Select Social Support Team among Spouses of Firefighters/Paramedics
- ◆ Training Course on 'Coathelp Techniques' for Social Support Team & Significant Others Meetings
- **♦** Organize Regular Talk Sessions/Meeting Activities

The Management of Emotionally Disturbing Interventions

Peri-Deployment Support Activities

- ◆ During Fire & Rescue Ops: On-Scene Support (Ops Away FiST)
 - Long Term Ops: Continuous Support through One-on-Ones
 - Multiple Stressor Debriefings (after high intensity periods/missions)
- ◆ Post-Intervention 'Demobilisation' & 'Defusing' Meetings:
 - Immediate Support within Fire & Rescue Department (Home FiST)
 - Post-Immediate Support with Fire & Rescue Department: Post Recovery
- ◆ For Large Scale Interventions:
 - Initialize Immediate 'Coathelp' Assuring Primary Needs by Social Support Team - Mobilize Off-Duty Colleagues
- ◆ Self-Help, Buddy Aid & Peer Support during Intervention
 - avoid secundary victimisation, prepare for rituals, handle trauma-related information, provide (official) recognition, stimulate coathelp

The Management of Emotionally Disturbing Interventions

Post-Deployment Support Activities

- ◆ End of intervention + 24 à 48 Hr: Information Session Fire-Fighters/Paramedics & their most significant others
- ♦ If decided so by the group:
 - End of intervention + 72 Hr : Multidisciplinary Traumatic Stress Debriefing (TSD1) with Fire & Rescue Workers – Emergency Medical Teams
 - Guided event reconstruction & psycho-education (somatic monitored debriefing)
 - Partners can be invited on request (psycho-educational counseling for spouses)
- ◆ For Large Scale Interventions: End of Intervention + 2 weeks (TSD2) On request: TSD3, TSD4, ...
- ◆ Special dates, rituals, group visit of disaster scene, ...
